

Call for Papers: FinanceCom 2010

Frankfurt, Germany
August 30th, 2010

Advances in information and communication technologies have made a significant impact on the financial services industry. Electronic trading systems, algorithmic trading and the automation of markets have profoundly altered the way markets work. The impact of technology has put pressure on all market participants and trading venues to adjust to and keep up with these technological advances, which has impacted competition, regulation and investment in these markets. FinanceCom 2010 invites papers that investigate the impact and resulting opportunities of technology, information, and associated areas on the financial services industry and financial markets.

After successful FinanceCom workshops in Sydney, Regensburg, Montreal, and Paris FinanceCom 2010 will be co-located with EFA 2010 in Frankfurt, Germany on August 30th, 2010. The workshop is open to multiple disciplines including information systems, finance, economics, and computer science but also behavioral sciences. We welcome research from any of those disciplines as well as work, which fits the scope of the workshop, from other disciplines.

FinanceCom 2010 will accept completed but unpublished research papers. Also papers should not have been accepted for publication at the time of submission. Because of the multi-disciplinary approach FinanceCom will offer two submission options to open the workshop to different research communities. Authors can either present a contribution as a working paper without publication or as a contribution for publication in proceedings. FinanceCom will not assume copyright for work accepted for presentation that has been submitted as a working paper.

Submission deadline: 21st June 2010

Submission Details

Papers must be written in English. Papers should be submitted via email to: chair@financecom.org.

Submissions should be in PDF format. Authors should submit two documents one anonymous submission and one cover page containing the author information and abstract. In addition, authors should provide the following information in their email: title of paper; names and affiliations of authors; name, email, snail mail, phone number, and an abstract. Submitted papers will be reviewed by the program committee. All correspondence will be with the specified primary contact. All authors should provide a final version of their contribution by the 15th of August 2010 for distribution to discussants.

Presenting authors will be encouraged to serve as discussants for other presentations.

Awards and Doctoral Students

Doctoral students are encouraged to submit research papers and participate in the program. A prize for the best Ph.D. student paper will be awarded.
